DETAILED ITINERARY DETAILS

Day 1 | (30-03-2026) : Arrive in Delhi & Drive to Nainital (8hrs.)

On Arrival at Delhi Airport / Railway Station, we drive to Nainital. Nainital is the lake of three sages, or the Tri Rishi Sarovar, as mentioned in the Manas Khand chapter of the Skanda Purana. As recorded in history, the three sages, Atri, Pulastya, and Pulaha, stopped over at Nainital on their pilgrimage to quench their thirst. Finding no water, they dug a hole and transferred some water into it to form the sacred lake of Tibet, Mansarovar. Thus the famous lake of Nainital came into existence. Another legend has it that the left eye of Lord Shiva's wife Sati fell in this centre and formed an emerald eye shaped lake, thus emerging the city of Nainital. Recent history records reveal that Nainital was brought into the limelight by P. Barron, a British sugar merchant, in 1839. The beauty of Nainital, with the central lake, cushioned among the forests, attracted this person to build a house named Pilgrim's Cottage and settle in Nainital. Arrive at Nainital, transfer to Hotel, Check in to the Hotel. The rest of the day is free at leisure. Evening you will walk to Naini Lake and Mall road. Overnight stay at Hotel at Nainital. (Nainital Mall Road Hotel pickup And Droop Not Included)

Day 2 | (31-03-2026) : Nainital Local SightSeeing

After Breakfast, a Full day is at leisure to explore the hill retreat of Nainital. It is blessed with scenic natural splendour and varied natural resources. Visit lakes tour of Bhim Tal, Sat Tal, Naukuchia Tal, Snow point, Thandi Sadak, cable car & Mall road etc. Later back to the Hotel. The rest of the day is free at leisure. Overnight stay at Hotel at Nainital. (Nainital Mall Road Sightseeing By Union Vehicle at Own Cost)

Day 3 | (01-04-2026) : Nainital - Neem Karoli baba Ashram Kainchi Dham Sightseeing - Nainital

Morning Breakfast And Full Day Sightseeing Neem Karoli baba Ashram Kainchi Dham, also known as the Shri Neem Karoli Baba Ashram, is a revered spiritual destination nestled in the serene Kumaon hills of Uttarakhand, India. Located approximately 17 kilometers from Nainital on the Nainital-Almora road, this ashram was established in 1962 by the esteemed Hindu guru Neem Karoli Baba, affectionately referred to as Maharaj-ji by his devotees , Overnight Stay At nainital

Day 4 | (02-04-2026) : Nainital to Kausani (3hrs.)

After Breakfast, check out from the hotel, then drive to Kausani. Kausani: nature's reserve and idle to spend a quiet holiday in the lap of nature with a stunning view of the Himalayan ranges. During his stay at Kausani, Mahatma Gandhi penned his memorable commentary on the 'Gita-Anashakti Yoga' inspired by the scenic grandeur of this richly gifted spot. Mahatma Gandhi was so impressed that he started calling it "Switzerland of India". The guesthouse where Mahatma Gandhi stayed is now known as the Anashakti Ashram. Famous Hindi poet Sumitra Nandan Pant was born at Kausani. Some of her early poems have described nature in its manifestations. Arrive at Kausani, transfer to Hotel, check in to Hotel. Later afternoon visited a Tea factory to see the complete process of manufacturing a Tea. The rest of the evening is at leisure, overnight stay at Hotel at Kausani

Day 5 | (03-04-2026) : Kausani - Baijnath - Kausani (1hrs.)

Today after breakfast, we proceeded to Baijnath Temple. Baijnath Temple is a venerable shrine of Uttrakhand. It is stationed 16 km from Kausani on the banks of Gomti in Gruda Valley. It is said to have been built by Kumaon Katyuri King in 1150 A.D. It is the capital of the Katyuri dynasty of kings who ruled over Uttarakhand during the 12th and 13th centuries. Earlier, Bijnath was known as 'Kartiykapura'. The temple is devoted to Lord Shiva and holds significant importance because the mythology says that Lord Shiva and Parvati were married on the conflux of River Gomti and Garur Ganga. Lord Shiva is one of the gods in the trinity (Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva); hence, this place becomes significantly more critical among devotees. Evening return back to Hotel and full day free for leisure. Overnight at Kausani

Day 6 | (04-04-2026) : Kausani to Corbett (4hrs.)

After Breakfast, we drive to Corbett. Corbett National Park: A appropriate land for the world species at Ramnagar in Nainital district in Uttarakhand. The Corbett national park is the most dwindling part of nature resisting the Himalayan foot hill & Shivalik ranges and is called the perfect tigers land. India's first noticed wildlife sanctuary and a national park established in 1936 brings the opportunity to behold the largest tigers population in the vicinity. Corbett remains open from mid-Nov to mid-June; the main reason for the park's closure during the rest of the year is that monsoons make most of the roads get washed away. After monsoon, the repair work starts, and it is only by nov.That roads are back in motive conditions. On arrival at Corbett, transfer to Hotel, check in to Hotel. Rest of the day free at leisure .overnight stay at Hotel at Corbett

Day 7 | (05-04-2026) : Corbett to Rishikesh (7hrs.)

After breakfast we checkout from hotel and proceed for Rishikesh by Road. Rishikesh: was named after the God Hrishikesh whose appearance is an answer to the lord penances by Rabhiya Rishi. The Holy Chardham yatra has its starting point from Rishikesh. Rishikesh is a famous Hindu religious destinations, popular amongst devotees, yoga persons and adventurers as well. Located on the banks of the sacred Ganga River, Rishikesh attracts thousands of pilgrims every day from India as well as abroad. Arrive at Rishikesh , transfer to hotel, Check in to hotel and rest of the day at leisure.Later visit to sightseeing Laxman Jhula , Gita Bhavan,etc. overnight stay at hotel at Rishikesh.

Day 8 | (06-04-2026) : Rishikesh to Delhi Drop (6hrs.)

After breakfast we checkout from hotel and proceed for Delhi by road. On arrival you will be transferred to the airport/railway station to board the flight/Train back to home
